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RESTORATIONS AT THE MAGISTERIAL PALACE, VALLETTA

During the financial year under review, restoration works were conducted on the frieze of the Supreme Council Chamber, known as the Hall of St. Michael and St. George.

The late sixteenth century frieze, as is well known, was executed by Matteo Perez de Alesio, commonly known as Matteo d'Aleccio and represents scenes from the Great Siege of 1565.

Restoration works in most of the motifs, on the walls of the Entrance Corridor, were also carried out during this period.

The motifs on the walls of the Prince of Wales Corridor, as well as those on the walls of the Armoury Corridor were also retouched. This work, however, was of a preliminary nature.

Restoration of the Palace Tapestries

One of the smaller panels of the Gobelins Tapestries hanging in the Tapestry Chamber, formerly Council Hall of the Order, was thoroughly restored during the financial year under review. The panel depicts the Coat-of-Arms of Grand Master Ramon de Perellos y Roccafull.

Palace Armoury

Extensive restoration works were carried out on the regimental colours preserved in the Palace Armoury.

Chevalier E. Caruana Dingli was born in Valletta in 1876 where he died in 1950. He produced portraits, genre pictures and occasionally historical subjects. He is chiefly known as a portrait-painter. 2. R. Bompiani: Portrait of a cardinal, signed — oils on canvas. $(18'' \times 14'')$.

Roberto Bompiani was born in Rome in 1812 and was a painter and sculptor. He studied at the Academy of St. Luke of which he was later elected president. Amongst his pictures may be mentioned "The Dance" and the portrait of Queen Marguerite. He died in Rome in 1908.

Salvatore Micallef was born in Valletta round 1810 and died in the last quarter of the same century. He was a pupil of Giuseppe Hyzler and painted amongst other things the altar-piece with the Virgin and Child enthroned in the church of St. Mary of Jesus, Valletta.

14. D. Serres: Valletta Harbour — water-colour. $(6\frac{3}{4}'' \times 12\frac{1}{2}'')$

Dominic Serres was a water-colour draughtsman and a teacher of drawing. He exhibited lanscapes at the Royal Academy from 1783 to 1787.

15. V. Fenech, four water-colour drawings depicting Malta costumes. $(6\frac{3}{4}'' \times 5'')$

16. S. Postiglione: A lady reading — pastels — $(18'' \times 15\frac{1}{2}'')$.

Salvatore Postiglione was born in Naples in 1861 and studied under Domenico Morelli. He painted sacred subjects and genre pictures as well as portraits. Amongst his works may be mentioned "St. Pier Damiani" in the Gallery of Modern Art in Rome. He died in 1906.
