Department of Museums

MISSION

The Department's mission is to ensure, by means of its diverse services, that present and future generations are able to derive cultural, educational and economic benefit from Malta's heritage.

ARCHAEOLOGY SECTION

Museums and Collections National Museum of Archaeology

Important initiatives linked to the conservation of the National Archaeological Collection and to the extension of the display at the Auberge de Provence were undertaken. Critical tenders for the procurement of 69 highquality museum showcases and for exhibition display material were adjudicated. Similarly, conservation interventions on a range of Bronze Age artefacts were entrusted to Dott S Guido, in view of the Museum's programme of exhibitions planned for 2001/2002. These conservation works were funded through a generous grant from the Paul Getty Foundation. A number of improvements were carried out to the existing Neolithic Gallery at the Auberge de Provence, as well as the Curatorial Offices. Other interventions included the fitting of waterproof membrane over part of the Auberge's roof, the installation of a security video intercom at the front door and the installation of a radio link with the external sites and with the Police General HO.

Museum of Roman Antiquities

Preparations and tender processing were undertaken in 2001 in view of planned upgrading of the display at this site in 2002, in collaboration with the Malta Tourism Authority. All the roofs were treated for waterproofing.

Special Initiatives

During 2001, a number of travelling exhibitions and other events were organised by the National Museum of Archaeology with the aim of highlighting the exceptional quality of Malta's archaeological heritage both locally and abroad. The more important events were:

- February 2001. Presentation by the Comune di Napoli of a replica of the Tessera Hospitalis – Malta's most ancient political document dating to the 2nd century BC;
- April to May 2001. Social Rhythms; Natural Rhythms; an exhibition of works by the Australian artist in residence John Stanfield:
- May to July 2001. Sacred Spaces in Prehistory; an exhibition held in collaboration with the Department of Youth and Sport consisting of ninety Neolithic artefacts, hosted at the Antico Monasterio di Santa Chiara in San Marino, as part of Malta's participation to the European Small Nations Games;
- In October, a start was made on the comprehensive cataloguing of the Museum's ancient coin collection, both that on display, as well as the reserve collection. This activity was initiated with the assistance of Dr Claudia Perassi, a lecturer in classical numismatics at the Università La Cattolica of Milan;
- In December, the Museum in collaboration with the Department of Chemistry of the Università La Sapienza of Rome carried out a number of non-impacting archaeometric investigations on a sample of ancient Phoenician and Roman items of personal decoration. The tests intended to throw new light on the metallurgical techniques that went into the manufacture of these items and on establishing their exact chemical composition. This activity was carried out in parallel with the JewelMed INCOMED Project and was largely funded by Italy's Centro Nazionale per la Ricerca;
- December 2001 to January 2002. *Prehistoric Treasures of an Island*; an exhibition held in collaboration with the Malta Tourism Authority and consisting of one hundred and forty Neolithic and Bronze Age artefacts, hosted at the KBC Bank Gallery in the Grand Place of Brussels.

External Sites

In 2001, a comprehensive programme of infrastructural works was carried out at many of the external sites and monuments under the care of the Section. The works, which are expected to proceed in 2002, were aimed at upgrading existing services and security arrangements, as well as at introducing new infrastructure where these are missing.

Mnajdra

On the night of 13 April 2001, unknown individuals penetrated into the perimeter fence of the Mnajdra Temples and upset close to sixty megaliths from their

original location. Worst hit were the internal apses of the Middle Temple, while some damage was also caused in the Lower Temple. This violent vandalistic attack on Malta's archaeological heritage caused widespread consternation throughout the world.

An intensive programme of conservation works was launched by the Section immediately after the attack. Extensive recording of the damage caused to the temples was carried out, both through photogrammetry and through conventional documentation and surveying media. Archaeological investigations of the areas disturbed by the vandals were also carried out by the curatorial staff of the National Museum of Archaeology, particularly at the rear of the Middle Temple. These investigations helped establish the extent of earlier, largely undocumented restoration exercises on this site. As with Hagar Qim, the conservation project at Mnajdra followed the principle of anastylosis with all the fallen megaliths being carefully placed into their original position.

An extensive number of infrastructural works were also installed on site, with particular attention being dedicated to security-related issues. A full complement of watchmen has been assigned to site, thereby ensuring a twenty-four-hour watch at this monument. The assistance of the Police and Army patrols ensures a greater degree of security at this, as well as at other archaeological sites in Malta. The temporary fence built in 1996 was further strengthened, while construction works on a larger security fence around the site was almost completed by the end of the year. A new timber Ticketing Booth together with a prefabricated watchman's hut was installed to provide additional shelter for the increased number of staff working on site. Other features include a temporary electricity generator, night lighting, mobile sanitary facilities and a radio link with the Police and with other departmental sites.

In June and December, delegates from the Archaeology Section accompanied Malta's Ambassador at meetings of the Bureau of the UNESCO World Heritage Committee to report on the situation at Mnajdra and Hagar Qim following the incident of 13th April 2001. On both occasions the Bureau expressed its full appreciation of the measures introduced by the Maltese Government to increase security on these World Heritage Monuments.

Hagar Qim

Conservation works at this site included the repair of the damage caused by the 1996 collapse in one of the lateral apses of the main temple complex. Works were carried out on the principle of anastylosis in which all the collapsed megaliths were put back in their original structural position. New falseworks were erected in two locations within the main temple in areas judged to be prone to collapse – these works were designed to be as visually inoffensive as possible.

Security at Hagar Qim was increased with the introduction of a prefabricated watchman's hut on site and the installation of a generator. The electricity supply is furthermore being upgraded with the construction of a sub-station and the extension of power cables to within the enclosure at Hagar Qim. A radio link has also been installed, thereby keeping the staff on site in constant contact with other departmental sites and with the Police.

Skorba and Ta' Hagrat

A number of facilities were installed at the Skorba and Ta' Hagrat temples to permit the introduction of a twenty-four-hour watch at this site. By the end of the year a prefabricated watchman's hut had been installed on both sites. Mains power supply was also introduced at Ta' Hagrat. At Skorba the perimeter fence was considerably strengthened and repairs were carried out to the rubble wall terracing encircling part of the site.

Tarxien Temples

The twenty-four-hour watch at this site was increased with a further complement of watchmen. The logistics at this site were improved with the installation of a three-phase power supply to replace the older inadequate installation. This allowed powering of the electrical system on site, which now also includes night lighting. Various maintenance works were carried out, which include the waterproofing of roofs over reception areas and repairs to the walkways. A small-scale investigation was carried out on the area affected by the 1999 collapse. It was established that the blocks dislodged by this event had in fact consisted of an early 20th century reconstruction. It was also possible to establish that the prehistoric situation of this part of the Tarxien Temples did not conform entirely to the modern day reconstruction.

Tas-Silg

Various security features were introduced on site, including a twenty-four-hour watchmen service, the introduction of electrical supply to site, the installation of a prefabricated watchmen's hut and of sanitary facilities. Repairs and improvements to the perimeter wall – including the construction of a new gate for heavy vehicles and machinery – were also carried out. Research excavations were carried out by the Missione Archeologica Italiana a Malta and by the University of Malta respectively in the site's north and south sectors. The Missione Archeologica also conducted important conservation works at various areas of the monument, which had been damaged by prolonged exposure to the elements and noxious root activity. These conservation works were carried out by a team of conservation technicians directed from the Istituto Centrale per il Restauro of Rome and was sponsored by a generous grant from the Italian Ministry of Foreign Affairs.

San Pawl Milgi

A number of facilities were installed at this site, as well as a twenty-four-hour watchmen service. The electrical installation on site was extended to include night lighting over the archaeological areas. Other works included the waterproofing of the roofs as well as the repair of the existing sanitary facilities on site. Conservation works and research excavations were carried out by the Missione Archeologica Italiana a Malta. As at Tas-Silg, conservation works were carried out by the Istituto Centrale per il Restauro and were funded from a grant provided by the Italian Ministry of Foreign Affairs.

St Paul's Catacombs

The reception area to this archaeological site was extensively redecorated and security measures were introduced in the cash handling.

Ghajn Tuffieha Roman Baths

Works were carried out to improve the security on site. The perimeter fence was strengthened, while new metal doors were placed in the shelters covering the two major mosaic floors on site. Damaging tree growth was radically cut back.

Archaeological Excavations

The Section was involved in various archaeological investigations, either directly or in a superintending capacity. Other important initiatives were carried out at the following locations:

Mdina - The ongoing road re-development project being carried out by the Mdina Rehabilitation Committee provided further opportunities to investigate other sections of this township's little understood archaeology. The most important sondage was carried out in St Paul's Square where a massive ashlar wall associated to two flagstone surfaces was documented. These features appear to be datable to the Roman Imperial period and earlier, although later Medieval strata were also documented.

Ghajn Klieb (Rabat) - A large, sealed tomb chamber was discovered at this location during the laying of electricity cables not far from other documented burials of the Phoenician as well as of later Classical periods. The tomb's state of preservation was good, allowing detailed examination to be carried out at a later date.

Borg In-Nadur (Birzebbugia) - A further section of what appears to be the Bronze Age defences of Borg In-Nadur was detected in the course of development immediately above the coastline of Birzebbugia. The remains consist of the footing of a massive wall, built of large ashlar blocks and on the same altitude as the defensive remains detected at Borg In-Nadur in 1999. Clearly these two sets of remains should belong to the same defensive system of the Bronze Age. Procedures for the acquisition of the strip of land in question were initiated to ensure that these remains are not further damaged.

St Agatha's College (Rabat) - A subterranean, rock-cut feature was detected within the grounds of St Agatha's College, in the course of development works. On investigation, the feature was found to be part of a funerary complex, probably part of a small catacomb. The feature was only partially excavated, while the development works in question were diverted to allow for the conservation of this feature.

Xemxija (St Paul's Bay) - The Museum also superintended an archaeological survey conducted by the Archaeology Department of the University of Malta in the Mistra/Xemxija area. In the course of this survey, a rock-cut burial chamber was found to contain some traces of its original funerary contents. The Museum authorised the excavation of these surviving deposits – under the direction of Dr Nicholas Vella – to ensure that they are not lost to any vandalistic activity.

Marine Sites - Remote sensing activities were carried out at sea and the excavation off the Gozo coast line, as well as trial trenching in Marsamxett Bay. These archaeological activities at sea were conducted by Museum officers in collaboration with the Institute of Nautical Archaeology of Texas University, together with volunteers from the University of Malta.

Other important investigations were carried out by Museum personnel in relation to ongoing development at sea, primarily in the Gozo Channel and off Comino leading to the documentation of one badly-weathered wreck site (Mid-to-Late Roman in date), and what appears to be Classical and Early Medieval harbour deposits at Santa Maria Bay. Other items of archaeological and of possibly geological relevance were reported by various diving enthusiasts – and duly inspected by Museum officers - from Marsaxlokk, off the Paceville coastline and from other harbour locations.

NATIONAL MUSEUM OF FINE ARTS

Exhibitions

Antonio Sciortino Monuments

2001 saw the second phase of the Museum's Antonio Sciortino Monuments and Public Sculpture exhibition.

Drawings by Mattia Preti (1613-1699)

Following the publication of an article by Judge Giovanni Bonello regarding his discovery of two original drawings by Mattia Preti at the Bibliotheca, two drawings, purchased as Preti's in the 1930s, came to light. The Bibliotheca drawings (integrated in a History of the Order) together with the Museum's new discoveries and other known Preti drawings were exhibited in December 2001. [vide Appendix A(i)]

Collaborations

The Museum collaborated with Fondazzjoni Patrimonju Malti in lending over seventy pieces of its collection of Sicilian ceramics to the exhibition Sicilian Maiolica in Malta. This was held at St James Cavalier Centre for Creativity and subsequently in Sicily. It is understood that the exhibition might also travel to Amsterdam.

The Museum agreed to lend a number of paintings and sculptures by *French artists* to an exhibition on French influence in Malta. This was being organised by the Sovereign Military Order of Malta and the French Embassy in Fort St Angelo to coincide with a proposed visit by descendants of French Grand Masters to Malta. The exhibition is being held in 2002.

In collaboration with the Italian Embassy, a commemorative plaque was unveiled to the Italian patriot *Francesco Crispi* who lived in exile in Tarxien from 1853-1854.

The Museum organised, on behalf of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, an exhibition of twelve contemporary Maltese artists, entitled *Malta*, *Crossroads of Civilisations*, at the European headquarters of the United Nations in Geneva. This formed part of Malta Week 2001 and was visited by a considerable number of delegates from all over the world.

The Museum lent some items related to the Knights of Malta to the exhibition *Sengleafest* organised in Senglea by the National Tourism Authority.

Seminars

Conservation Projects at St John's

A public presentation on the Conservation Projects at St John's Co-Cathedral, financed by the IV Italo-Maltese Financial Protocol, was held in June 2001.

La Memoire Sculptée de l'Europe

Following the exhibition *Antonio Sciortino Monuments*, the Museums Department participated at a seminar that took place at the Headquarters of the Council of Europe in Strasbourg in December 2001.

Museum Loans

Genoa

A 19th century wooden model of Valletta was lent to the exhibition *La Commenda dell'Ordine di Malta* organised by the Soprintendenza per I Beni Architettonici e per il Paesaggio della Liguria in Genova from May to September, 2001.

Malta Tourism Authority

A number of paintings were loaned to the exhibition The Maritime History of Senglea organised by the Malta Tourism Authority in October 2001.

Malta Week in Geneva

The bronze statue Rhythmii Vitae by Antonio Sciortino was lent to the exhibition held at the United Nations in Geneva in November 2001.

St James Cavalier Centre for Creativity - Angels

A number of Museum exhibits and others from the Reserve Collection were lent to the Christmas season exhibition *Angels*, held at St James Cavalier Centre for Creativity, Valletta.

Superintendence

Vilhena Monument

The Museum of Fine Arts superintended the cleaning of the 18th century monument to Grand Master Manoel de Vilhena, undertaken by Ditta Sante Guido, Rome.

St John's Co-Cathedral

The Museum of Fine Arts is currently superintending conservation measures being undertaken by the Foundation of St John's on the *St George and the Dragon* by Mattia Preti, the altarpiece from the Chapel of the Langue of Aragon.

The cleaning of the *St Jerome* by Caravaggio as undertaken by ICR, Rome, on location in the Oratory of St John, was also superintended.

Malta Centre for Restoration Projects

An ongoing, cordial working relationship has been established with the Malta Centre for Restoration. This Centre regularly provides consultation and practical assistance in restoration processes. A number of Museum artefacts are also currently in restoration at the Malta Centre for Restoration as didactic projects. Further similar projects are being discussed.

Donations

- David Elyan Donation Mr David Elyan presented five School Print lithographs by Picasso, Braque, Matisse, Leger and Dufy to the Museum. The Elyan Donation is particularly appreciated since the Museum owns only a handful of works by contemporary artists of world renown. An exhibition brochure by D Vella was published.
- Henry Briffa Donation A portrait of the late Miss M R Briffa by Anton Inglott was presented to the Museum by her brother Mr H Briffa. This had originally been withheld from export by Miss Briffa, as a work of national interest.
- Captain O F Gollcher Art and Archaeology Foundation The Gollcher Foundation donated two works of art, namely Kneeling woman, oil on panel, by J Udel (19th century) and a Self Portrait, engraving, attributed to Rembrandt.
- Michiko Kinjo Donation The Japanese artist, Ms Michiko Kinjo, presented an original ink drawing and a number of limited edition offset prints, together with their respective photographic plates, to the Museum.

- Pino Lo Monaco Donation The Sicilian artist, Sig Pino Lo Monaco, donated two of his oil paintings to the Museum, namely Paesaggio Fantastico and La Scala.
- Forthcoming Extended Loan -The Museum is also in the concluding phases of discussions with the Central Bank of Malta for the extended loan of a very important painting by an 18th century Maltese artist.

Restoration Studies

Two of the Museum's senior restorers of painting, are reported to be doing well in their course of studies at the Malta Centre for Restoration.

Visits to the Museum

Numerous personalities and groups visited the Museum's exhibitions, especially the President of Malta, the Prime Minister, as well as *Patrimonju* Patrons, Bank of Valletta Pensioners, the Sicilian District Governor of the Rotary Club, Rotary Club Wives, and others. An encouraging number of leisure groups and schoolchildren also visited the museum.

Media coverage

Television Malta together with the other Maltese television stations gave regular and valuable coverage to the Museum and its exhibitions and restoration projects throughout the year.

Capital Projects

Casa Scaglia: New premises adjacent to the National Museum of Fine Arts

This project has proceeded with the continued refurbishment of the premises through the installation of electrical circuitry.

ETNOGRAPHY SECTION

The Inquisitor's Palace

The Inquisitor's Palace is in the process of being rehabilitated in order to host an exhibition on the religious perceptions and values in Maltese culture and identity.

The rehabilitation of the prison complex continued by the opening up of blocked doors and apertures, the installation of a number of iron bars and gates in windows and doors, and the scraping of the cells from thick layers of whitewash. This has led to the discovery of a great number of graffiti ranging from dates, ships, initials, symbols, and quotations in Arabic from the Koran, together with three murals of ships. Thirteen red deal wooden doors were installed in all the cells of the prison complex. The design of the doors has been based on a description of the prison warden of the 1630s.

Enemalta Corporation handed over the possession of a room that the corporation owned in the Inquisitor's Palace. It was in a very bad state of conservation. This room, which in the 17th century used to be the prison warden's room, a prison cell and probably a torture room, is now in the process of being rehabilitated into a torture chamber.

Restoration and structural works were carried out by the Cottonera Rehabilitation Project and the Marsa Garage employees. The entire roof of the Inquisitor's Palace was covered with waterproof membrane. A new three-phase electrical supply has been installed at the palace as the first step towards changing the entire electrical system of the building, which should commence next year. Some areas with modern cement or concrete flooring were removed and replaced with limestone flagstones.

The cesspit of the middle cell of the Gori Pannellini prison complex is being cleared from all sort of building material deposited there in recent times. Nothing particularly noteworthy has been found there, as yet, other than some fragments of broken pottery and some large sculptured stones. Another bell-shaped well has been discovered in the corridor which leads from the prison cells to the tribunal room during works for the installation of the three phase electrical cable.

Preliminary discussions are going on with the Malta Tourism Authority for the possible partnership with the Museums Department to restore the façade of the Inquisitor's Palace.

Initiatives

Phase I of the restoration of the friezes in the Ruffo Apartments by the Malta Restoration Centre has been completed.

Form III students of the Canon P Pullicino Girls' Secondary School performed a re-enactment of a trial in front of an inquisitor in the tribunal room of the Palace. The same was performed for the third year running by students of San Anton School.

The Inquisitor's Palace featured in various television and radio informative and educational programmes, in numerous newspaper features, and on the popular *La Macchina del Tempo* on Italian television station Retequattro.

The palace was the venue for a number of evening social functions and activities.

During 2001, the Museum was entrusted with the organisation of the European Heritage Days, which this year had the theme Gardens — A historical and cultural perspective between 21 and 28 October. The Museum is also currently involved in the setting up of a computerised database for a national protective inventory of the cultural heritage of the Maltese islands.

The Ethnography Section also started collecting holy pictures, as icons of popular religious devotion; children's toys, especially manual ones, which are rapidly disappearing in our technological era; souvenirs of First Holy Communion, Confirmation and Marriage as symbols of the changing role and significance of modern rites of passage. An initial effort is also being made to start recording oral stories from the Harbour Area as part of our intangible cultural heritage.

The collection of the Ethnography Section was enhanced through various donations, purchases and transfers. [vide Appendices B(i)-B(ii)].

MARITIME MUSEUM

In the course of the year 2001, the Maritime Museum received 35,272 visitors. [Appendix C(i)]

The Maritime Museum Collections were enhanced through the acquisition of a total of 386 artefacts (278 donations, 10 transfers from other museums and government institutions, 48 retrievals, 2 loans and 48 purchases). [vide Appendix C(i)-C(vii)]

The Maritime Museum Reference Library and Archive was enhanced through the acquisition by purchase and donations of several publications, photographs, manuscript and documents.

In 2001 the Curator attended the 1st Congress of European Maritime Museums, the 4th Congress of the Common European Maritime Heritage and the 8th Forum of the Mediterranean Maritime Museum held within the framework of the 4th Annual Conference of the International Conference of Museums held at Barcelona, Spain from 27 June to 2 July 2001.

The Friends of the Maritime Museum Association continued to support the Maritime Museum. Besides publicising the Maritime Museum, holding seminars on Malta's maritime heritage and history, the Friends were instrumental in enhancing the Maritime Museum's collections through the several donations of artefacts. The Friends held other cultural activities and outings and regularly published a newsletter for distribution among its members.

In addition to routine cleaning and maintenance of artefacts, four ships' models, one antique shop's sign and other artefacts pertaining to the Maritime Museum were restored and cleaned at the Maritime Museum's model restoration laboratory. The Malta Centre for Restoration at Bighi is currently restoring, free of charge, two oil paintings on canvas pertaining to the Maritime Museum Collections.

Throughout the year, the Museum staff was engaged in a number of projects with a view to enhancing the Museum's permanent exhibition and services to the public. Works are still being carried out in revamping the Museum's reception area and in the setting up of a new permanent exhibition on marine engineering and propulsion centring on the full-scale steam engine of the former grab dredger *Anadrian*. The exhibition is scheduled to be inaugurated in July 2002.

On 19 April, His Royal Highness the Duke of Edinburgh and suite paid an official visit to the Maritime Museum to view the recently inaugurated permanent exhibition on *The Royal Navy and Malta*.

The Maritime Museum Reference Library was made available for consultation by bona fide students and research workers.

Proposals for Euromed Programme

Proposal No 1: Island sea links in the Mediterranean during the first half of the 20th century - The scope of this proposal is to create a study group, with participants from around the Mediterranean littoral, to investigate, study and report the various facets of the matter. This would involve studies on the typology of sea crafts, their construction and management, sea routes, types of service, ports and port facilities. All this with a view to better understanding an important and complex factor that affects the character and life of islanders.

Proposal No 2: Traditional inshore sea crafts in the Mediterranean basin - The scope of this proposal is to create a study group capable of studying the different

typologies of traditional small wooden boats, their use, evolution, construction, and cultural significance. It is hoped that participants would contribute to a better understanding of these humble workhorses of the sea and their imprint on the formation of a Mediterranean cultural identity.

Proposal No 3: The development of Naval Bases in the Mediterranean during the first half of the 20th century-The scope of this proposal is to create a study group to investigate, study and report on the significance, evolution and development of naval bases in the Mediterranean from 1900 to the outbreak of World War II. The Museum's involvement would be to steer and coordinate the project, organise meetings and seminars and publish proceedings and reports.

THE PALACE ARMOURY

Time was again dedicated to the ongoing sorting out of the reserve-collection. A number of items including 17th and 18th century rapiers and bayonets were removed from the Palace corridors and will eventually be displayed in the Palace Armoury.

Restoration work was carried out at the Maritime Museum on the 16th century wrought-iron breechloading cannon recovered from the seabed in 2000.

Work continued at a steady pace towards setting up the new conservation workshop at the Armoury. This new workshop formed part of the Bank of Valletta Millennium Project including the restoration of the main group of armour in the collection. This involved the construction of a partition in the Left Hall. By the end of March, the workshop was completed. A team of armour conservation experts from the Royal Armouries in Leeds spent two weeks in Malta for the preparatory phase of the project.

Mr Graham Priest, internationally renowned expert on bayonets, re-visited the Armoury to finalise his previously commenced assessment of the Armoury's rare bayonet collection

Restoration work was carried out on a pair of very rare 18th century, flintlock, rocket launchers. Restoration work continued on a number of fine rapiers and on a pair of suits of armour returned to the Armoury from the Museum of Fine Arts.

The Museum supervised the recovery of an 18th century iron Carronade gun-barrel from Marsa. Preliminary conservation work was carried out on the Carronade at the Maritime Museum.

Assistance and advice were given to the Armed Forces of Malta regarding the care and maintenance of the various antique military items held by the Armed Forces. Under the Section's guidance, restoration works on the old gun carriages at the AFM Headquarters were carried on. The Armed Forces of Malta Recovery Unit again provided assistance in the transporting of old cannon.

Several tours of the Armoury were conducted. Apart from the usual specialised study groups of foreign culture organisations, visitors included a number of prominent foreign delegates and representatives.

THE NATIONAL WAR MUSEUM - ST ELMO

General maintenance works were carried out throughout the year. The items that had been displaced by the refurbishment works of the previous year were inspected and cleaned and are displayed temporarily in the newly-refurbished Left Annexe.

Restoration works were carried out on the right-side torpedo in the foyer. The E-Boat, the German submarine gun in the courtyard was completed, and the 18th century English muzzle-loading gun was displayed outside the Museum.

NATURAL HISTORY MUSEUM - MDINA

In the first months of the year, restoration works were carried out on the section that will eventually house the Vertebrate Collections. The first phase of work on the upgrading of the Museum was initiated this year, including the whitewashing, painting of doors, and installation of soffits and fitted carpets.

Owing to structural faults in the rear part of the Palace, the Mammal and Skeletal Anatomy Sections had to be closed. These two displays were upgraded in the early months of 2001. A small display on Maltese Mammals was set up in the lower floor of the Museum.

The cataloguing of the library is being finalised. This library is being furnished as much as possible with Melitensia Publications relating to Natural Sciences. The Museum will focus its displays on local biota, ecosystems and habitats. Other themes will cover evolution, extinction and exploitation of natural resources.

Acquisitions

The National Museum of Natural History acquired a number of important specimens for its reference collections. The collections which were acquired through donations and which included a large number of protected species were registered with the Environment Protection Department.
