Section 4 – Drawing Conventions

- 1. Plans, sections, and elevations of structure at a scale of 1:100, 1:50 and 1:20 for details of:
 - (i) Existing building
 - (ii) Weathering forms (as per Section 2, Item 3),
 - (iii) Proposed interventions in building (as per Section 3, item 2)

2. Detailed photographic record of the building, internally and externally, in its present state including all features. This should be crossed-referenced to plans to indicate the position from where the photographs were taken.
