Property Description

Xlendi Tower was built in 1650 with a squarish plan and thick battered walls. It consisted of two stories with the main entrance accessible through a flight of steps and a wooden drawbridge of the lifting bridge type.

The main purpose of this tower was to deny entrance and use of Xlendi to pirates and evaders of quarantine.

Xlendi Tower is now the oldest coast watch-tower still standing in Gozo.

The tower restoration is a joint venture between Din l-Art Helwa and il-Munxar


