Outline Description	Coastal redoubt - remains
Property Description	Also known as Ramla Middle redoubt or Vendôme redoubt. Ramla Redoubt was one of the coastal works of fortification erected by the Knights in 1715/16. Only a small section of the salient of the pentagonal platform has survived above ground. This structure originally consisted of a pentagonal platform with short flanks and low parapet, closed off at the gorge by a rectangular blockhouse.
